We also were unable to procure any cleaning products to wipe off doors, tables and chairs. There is simply nothing left to buy in the stores.

In the end we decided it wasn't about the number 250. Why would 249 or 175 be any safer. I suspect they just want to be able to track us easily if a case shows up. But really it is about limiting contact between groups of people and keeping our most at risk people safe. We don't want to see this virus spread any quicker than it already is. As a result, the Pastor with help from our Board have decided to suspend Sunday services.

We really appreciate those of you who have phoned and offered us your advice and opinions, and we also are so blessed by those of you already inquiring how to give your offerings in this next period. We have put all of that information on our Website (under 'About Us'), and we also appreciate that many of you will simply set that money aside and give once we are able to meet again. However you choose to give or hold your offerings, we are very grateful for your continued support.
